NOTICE OF RACE

1 Rules

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The Preamble to RRS Part 4 and RRS 40 is changed to require personal flotation devices (PFD's) to be worn at all times when afloat, except when changing clothing.
- 1.3 All Master entrants shall start and finish together and be scored as a single fleet.
- 1.4 All non-Master entrants shall start and finish together and be scored as a single fleet.
- 1.5 Competitors may choose Standard, Radial or 4.7 rigs at their discretion, provided that all rig changes are made on shore and all sails have the same number.
- 1.6 Appendix G3 applies.
- 1.7 The prescriptions of Sail Canada will apply and will be posted on the official notice board.

2 Eligibility and Entry

2.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the Laser class whose skippers have reached the age of 35 by the regatta start date. Competitors shall be assigned to the following age divisions based on their age on the first day of the regatta:

Apprentice – 35-44 years of age Master – 45-54 years of age Grand Master – 55-64 years of age Great Grand Master – 65+ years of age

- 2.2 There will be a non-Masters fleet if 10 or more Lasers (Laser, Radial, 4.7) have registered by August 1, 2017.
- 2.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online or onsite registration process.

3 Fees

3.1 Early registration prior to August 1, 2017

Training camp \$200.00 Regatta \$90.00

3.2 Late Registration (e.g. August 1 and after or onsite)

Training camp \$225.00 Regatta \$115.00

- 3.3 The Training camp and Regatta fees includes breakfast and welcome reception.
- 3.4 Bag lunches will be available for \$10.00 per day and daily dinner tickets are \$15.00

4 Sailing Instructions

Sailing Instructions will be available at registration.

5 Venue

Racing will take place on the waters of Lake Wabamun, Alberta.

6 Courses

The courses to be sailed will be Windward/Leeward with a downwind finish.

On the race days, there will be debriefs after the racing by the out of country event coach, chief judge and the race officer.

8 Scoring

- 8.1 The Low Point Scoring System (Appendix A) shall be used, as modified below.
- 8.2 The number of races scheduled is ten (10). The minimum number of races required to constitute a championship is three (3) races.
- 8.3 When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 8.4 For the Masters fleet:
 - The ILCA-NA Masters handicap system will be used to determine the overall series winner. For each race counted in the competitor's final score, the following points will be added: Apprentices, 3 points; Masters, 2 points; Grand Masters, 1 point; Great Grand Masters, 0 points. These points will be listed as a race, but this race doesn't count toward the total number of races to constitute a series or races to exclude.
 - ii The boat's overall score will be the sum of its counted races plus the race containing the Masters handicap points.
 - iii All prize winners are determined by extraction from the overall results without rescoring.

9 Prizes

Prizes will be awarded as follows:
ILCA-NA Master Handicap - 1st, 2nd and 3rd
Divisional Champions — 1st
Top Female - 1st
Non-Masters event - 1st, 2nd and 3rd

10 Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

11 Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance. The organizing authority does not accept any responsibility for verifying that a boat has valid third-party liability insurance.

12 Rights to Use Name and Likeness

In participating in an event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing Authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition in this events in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the events without compensation.
